

India, US stand together in fight against terror: Trump speaks to PM Modi





Abhijit Kalita, Guwahati: At least 26 people, two foreign tourists among them, were killed by a group of terrorists who emerged from the dense forests around the trekking paradise of the Baisaran meadows in the upper reaches of Pahalgam on Tuesday afternoon. A number of others were wounded, including with critical injuries, and the death toll is likely to rise, official sources told, though there is no official casualty data from the government as yet. Morigaon District Administration Directs BLOs to Raise Awareness on Polling Centre Changes

Lipika Bora, Morigaon: With the upcoming second phase of the Panchayat elections scheduled for May 7, the Morigaon district administration has issued a directive to Booth Level Officers (BLOs) to raise awareness among voters regarding



changes in polling centres. The directive aims to address the confusion that may arise due to discrepancies between Panchayat and Legislative Assembly polling stations. The official notice, signed by Additional Deputy Commissioner Nitisha Bora, specifically calls on BLOs from the 52-Jagiroad (SC), 53-Lahorighat, and 54-Morigaon Legislative Assembly constituencies to carry out voter awareness activities in collaboration with Panchayat secretaries. The goal is to ensure that voters are well-informed about their correct polling locations to prevent any difficulty on the day of voting. According to the notice, Morigaon district will witness polling at a total of 972 polling stations, with 339 in Jagiroad, 364 in Lahorighat, and 269 in Morigaon constituency. The administration emphasizes the importance of localized outreach to avoid any last-minute confusion and ensure smooth electoral participation. With the elections nearing, the Morigaon district administration is taking proactive steps to ensure voters are not misled or inconvenienced due to changes in polling centre assignments, especially in rural areas under the Panchayati system.

The athlete has primarily competed in the heavyweight women's category (over 73 kg), with occasional participation in the under 73 kg category. "From the very beginning I used to participate in over 73 KG women. That is heavyweight category," she explains. "Once or twice, I have participated in under 73 KG when someone else had already been selected in heavyweight." A significant breakthrough came in 2016 when she secured her first gold medal at the Senior Nationals held in Visakhapatnam. More recently, she earned a bronze medal at the Asian Championship last year, marking India's first medal in a recognized international Taekwondo tournament in a decade.
