

# The Burmese Invasion and Assam's Struggle for Freedom

The early 19th century was a difficult time for Assam. The Ahom kingdom, which had ruled the region for nearly six hundred years, was weakening. Internal conflicts and power struggles made the administration unstable. This weakness attracted foreign powers, and among them were the Burmese. The Burmese invasions of Assam took place between 1817 and 1826. These invasions caused great destruction and suffering. The people of Assam had to fight hard to protect their land, but they could not resist the powerful Burmese forces. ## Two Dead, Two Injured In Collision Between Two **Motorcycles In Darrang**

Mangaldai: In a tragic incident, a fatal accident took place at Gorapori Nisopi Kherajgaon under Dhula police station in Assam's Darrang district today morning. The road accident occurred when two motorcycles collided head-on with each other, claiming the life of two individuals while another two persons sustained injuries. A bajaj Pulsar bearing registration number AS 13R 3830 and a TVS Glamour registered as AS 13G 7937 were the two motorbikes involved in the crash. The deceased have been identified as Sukur Ali of Algachar village and Jamir Ali of Gorapori village. The identity of the injured persons are Kitab Ali and Nasiruddin Ali. The injured duo were initially admitted to Mangaldai Civil Hospital for medical treatment. One of them had to be rushed to the Gauhati Medical College and Hospital (GMCH) for better treatment after his condition turned critical. Meanwhile, earlier last week, an Indian Air Force officer met with a road accident that took place on the Barpeta-Howly road in Assam, leaving him injured. The injured officer was identified as Dharmendra Kumar who was travelling from Shillong to Bagdogra in West Bengal along with his colleague. The road mishap occurred when a Swift Dzire vehicle bearing registration number AS 15M 6698 approaching from the opposite direction collided with their vehicle at a high speed.


# Salman Khan's Sikandar leaked online hours before release, fans disappointed

would serve the districts of Biswanath, Lakhimpur, and Sonitpur. Following the inauguration, he convened a meeting with officials from the Transport Department and the facility's managing company, where a presentation was delivered on vehicle fitness testing procedures. Subsequently, Dr Sarma performed the Bhoomi Pujan ceremony and laid the foundation stone for a ropeway connecting Biswanath Ghat to Umatumoni River Island. The project, estimated to be constructed at <sup>1</sup> 58.81 crore, would span 446 metres and accommodate 300 passengers per hour. In addition to facilitating transportation, it is expected to attract tourists and pilgrims to the region. He also inaugurated multiple projects, including the Circuit House (1 12.98 crore), Office of the Biswanath Zila Parishad (1 4 crore), the Tribal Rest House (1 1 crore), and the Assistant Commissioner's residence (191 lakh). Furthermore, he laid the foundation stone for an Industrial Park at Borgang's No. 2 Dhemaji Bari (1 31.54 crore), an Accredited Driver Training Centre, and an Automated Driving Test Track (1 4 crore). Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Sharma reiterated the state government's commitment to accelerating Assam's development and ensuring the fulfilment of all public commitments. He noted that discussions on constructing a ropeway in Biswanath commenced in 2016-17, and with the laying of the foundation stone for the Biswanath Ghat-Umatumoni River Island ropeway, the project has now entered its implementation phase. He highlighted that this would be Assam's second ropeway, following the Guwahati-North Guwahati project, and stated that the government aims to complete it within 18 months. Regarding the Accredited Driver Training Centre, he stated that it would provide both driving lessons and licences. He underscored the importance of language proficiency, encouraging learners to acquire skills in Hindi and English to enhance employment opportunities outside the state and abroad. He cited Japan's plan to recruit 50,000 youths from Assam within the next five years and urged the centre's management to introduce specialised language training. The inauguration function was graced by a few district officials, including additional DC (revenue and disaster management) Bipul Kumar Das and assistant commissioner Pooja Borah, besides delegates from some of the departments that will assist the DEOC during times of crisis.
